After eight events during the year, **the French J/70 Cup 2025**, which ended in November 2025, saw the victory of the **Jour J** team, helmed by **Beatrice JOYAUD**. Béatrice is the first woman to win this trophy.

**The events** : Massilia Cup - Marseille, Spi Ouest France - La Trinité, J/70 Cup - Biscarrosse, French Championship - La Rochelle, Trophée SEMAC - Marseille, Atlantique Télégramme - Lorient, J/70 Cup - Hyères, Navigatlantique - La Rochelle.

**38 boats** participated to the **French J/70 Cup 2025**. The French fleet continues to grow.

Second place for **the French J/70 Cup 2025** was **Sailing Impact** helmed by **Philippe GUIGNE**, and third place for **Leclerc Hennebont** helmed by **Richard Fromentin**.

So, these three teams have been qualified for the **2026 World Championship in Cascais**.



**The Class Rules changes that the World Council proposed were approved (with a few wordsmithing updates) by World Sailing effective 01 February 2026. One Rule change that makes a notable difference in the way we sail the boat is the ability to remove the winches, as they are now optional equipment.**

**Thomas Loesch, an International Measurer for the J/70 Class, has put together a document to guide you through the process. You can find the**

As always, J/70 Class Rules are closed—which means if it doesn't say specifically you can, then by the Class Rules you *cannot*. This includes how you fair the center seam, and what you can do within the Rules for the keel, keel wedges and rudder.

As the membership knows, the Class has adopted Vakaros RaceSense for all major Championships with great success. The IJ70CA has a complete set of equipment and is ready to support regattas. Contact Chris Howell for more information on how to take advantage of RaceSense at your next major event. To get the best performance from your Atlas 2 and RaceSense:

1. It is recommended by the J/70 Class Technical Chair and Vakaros that the Atlas 2 should be the top unit in the stack of instruments.
2. You should calibrate your unit before the start of the regatta.

These two recommendations should help you get the best performance.

For more information on Vakaros and RaceSense, you can visit <https://vakaros.com/pages/racesense>. Just a few things that RaceSense does for you: eliminate pinging, immediate OCS calls, two-boat starting line, eliminate starting penalty flags, zone notification, and it calls the finishes (getting the close downwind finishes correct).

## **LOOKING AHEAD**

The Technical Committee is looking forward to seeing members at the Corinthian Worlds in Marseille, Europeans in Barcelona, Mixed-Plus Worlds in Copenhagen, Worlds in Cascais, North Americans in Annapolis and South Americans in Chile. The Class continues to mature as 99% of the boats attending Championships already have MDs, most sails are coming certified from a loft, and we increasingly use the event self-compliance form. This has made the measurement process go a bit faster and be less cumbersome to the members and measurement team. To continue with inspection, we are able to conduct random spots checks, which has been working well.

I am honored as I travel to work with the talented Measurers and members of the IJ/70CA Technical Committee to make our Class even better. It is in great shape with all the work the Technical Committee has already put in to get us to this point. # J/70 EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP 2026

*This summer, Barcelona will become the epicenter of international one-design sailing as the Reial Club Nàutic de Barcelona hosts the J/70 European Championship 2026. From 18 to 26 July, more than 500 sailors from across the globe will gather to compete in one of the most anticipated regattas on the international calendar.*

### **A Championship of Global Dimension**

Organized by the Reial Club Nàutic de Barcelona (RCNB) in collaboration with the International J/70 Class Association (IJ70CA), the Royal Spanish Sailing Federation (RFEV), the Catalan Sailing Federation and the Spanish J/70 Owners Association, the 2026 edition is set to be one of the strongest European Championships ever staged. Fleet registration reached its maximum of 100 boats in less than two hours after pre-

registration opened. Representing 22 nationalities, the entry list includes teams from Australia, Austria, Brazil, Denmark, Spain, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Great Britain, Mexico, Monaco, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Switzerland, Sweden, Turkey and the United States.

An additional 32 teams remain on the waiting list — clear proof of the Class's strength and the international appeal of Barcelona as host city.

### **Barcelona: Where Sailing Meets Culture**

Set along the Mediterranean coast, Barcelona offers a rare combination of reliable sea conditions, steady summer winds and world-class infrastructure. The race area provides open-water sailing with fair and competitive conditions, ideal for high-performance one-design racing.

Beyond the racecourse, the city delivers an unmatched cultural experience. From its historic maritime legacy to its dynamic contemporary lifestyle, Barcelona blends sport, gastronomy, architecture and leisure in a way few sailing venues can.

# Spain Report

## BARCELONA

International Barcelona Winter Series confirms itself as one of the Mediterranean's most attractive events.

Photo: Since last September, the International Barcelona Winter Series for J/70s have been held monthly, impeccably organized by the Real Club Náutico de Barcelona. The circuit features seven events and will wrap up in March, coinciding with the first series of the International Barcelona Spring Regattas, which will include three additional series (March, April and May).

This winter circuit, staged in Barcelona, the host city for the next European Championship, has proven highly successful among competitors thanks to a combination of factors: weather, fleet quality, organization and technology.

### **Strong turnout: 30 teams from more than 10 countries**

Participation has been strong. In recent series the fleet has reached around thirty teams of a high standard, coming from European countries such as the United Kingdom, Portugal, Germany, Hungary, Poland, Ukraine, Lithuania, France, Denmark, Switzerland, Austria and Spain.

### **Excellent conditions**

Barcelona has been delivering outstanding weather, allowing racing to take place across a wide range of conditions, from heats in light 5–6-knot breezes and flat water to others in more than 20 knots with thrilling waves. Conditions are generally favorable and, even when the opposite occurs, such as last January, it rarely rains, and sunshine is often present, bringing pleasant temperatures.

## Plenty of racing

Each series features three days of competition, from Friday to Sunday, with several teams taking advantage of Thursday for training. The schedule calls for 10–12 races per series, with a maximum of four races per day and one discard per event. Proof of that, from the first event through the fifth, held last month, 42 races have already been completed.

## Sailor-focused organization

All series feature umpires conducting on-the-water judging, which greatly reduces the likelihood of protests ashore. The race committee is highly experienced, and its decisions on the water typically earn broad acceptance among sailors. Courses are set using automated, radio-controlled marks, and the event uses Vakaros' RaceSense system, the latest technology that helps both competitors and the race committee streamline starting procedures while providing many other features for running the

competition. On Saturdays after racing, the club's terrace offers all participants free beer and snacks to foster a great fleet atmosphere. On Sundays, upon returning ashore, there is always a prizegiving with separate standings for each event, although there is also an overall ranking that considers all races sailed across the seven events.

## A very tight fleet

Picking favorites is difficult. In fact, no team has managed to repeat a series win so far. For now, the most consistent have been Spain's HSN Sailing Team, provisional overall leaders, Bodega Can Marlés, second overall and runner-up in the most recent event, and Noticia, third overall and winner of the fifth event. Other high-level teams that have won earlier series include Germany's Diva (winner of the fourth series), Denmark's Sassy (winners of the third event), Galicia's Mar-natura (winners of the second event and the Spanish Cup), and the UK's Seriousfun (winners of the first event in September). Other front-running teams in the competition include Hang Ten, Let it Be and Portugal's Active Sailing.

The event will feature cutting-edge race technology, including **Vakros Atlas 2 RaceSense** onboard each boat and **MarkSetBots** on the racecourse for precise, efficient and environmentally friendly marksetting.

Competitors can look forward to:


- A full program including **one practice day** and **four Championship race days**

## Australia's J/70 Scene — Tight Racing, Consistent Performers

*The J/70 Class continues to grow Down Under, both in competitive strength and community engagement. High-quality and close one-design racing, with multiple boats capable of winning on any given day is the ongoing attraction to the fleet.*

Three major Clubs support the J/70 Class: **Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron and Sandringham Yacht Club** in Victoria and **Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron** in Sydney, New South Wales. Each club offers regular racing and development pathways, with club programs actively engaging and developing the next generation of keelboat racers.

More of our members are also looking to compete at various events around the world despite the logistical challenges of travelling so far away from home.

In 2025, we introduced the J-Cup Australia series that provides a ranking for places to be offered at the following year's Open World Championship. The events included:

- J-Cup #1 • Australian Titles – 13-18 Jan 2025, Sandringham Yacht Club
- J-Cup #2 • East Coast Championship – 5-7th April 2025, Lake Macquarie YC
- J-Cup #3 • NSW State Championship – 1-3 Nov 2025, Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron
- J-Cup #4 • VIC State Championship – 21-23 November 2025, Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron

### **2025 Australian J/70 National Championship — Inaugural J-Cup Event**

The 2025 **J/70 Australian Championship**, hosted by **Sandringham Yacht Club** on **Port Phillip Bay**, marked both the pinnacle of the summer sailing season and the first event of the new J-Cup Australia series. A strong

fleet of 91 sailors on 21 boats contested the Nationals, with excellent representation across age groups and divisions, featuring **five interstate teams, seven youth teams and 14 Corinthian entries**. In a tightly fought regatta with a mix of seabreezes and wild Port Phillip conditions, **Chris Dare's AMBITION** — crewed by Dare, David Chapman, Jeremy O'Connell and Lockie Dare — sailed exceptionally consistently and never placed outside the top three, ultimately clinching the National title. Second overall was **David Doherty's MATADOR**, and **Steve Proud's SWISH** rounded out the podium.

Across other divisions, **FUBAR** topped both the **Corinthian** and **Youth** categories, while **JABIRU** took the **Mixed Plus** honours — reflecting the competitive diversity that has become a hallmark of Australian J/70 racing.

This event set the tone for the inaugural **J-Cup Australia Series**, with its results forming an integral part of national ranking and World Championship nomination criteria.

**J-Cup Australia #2 — Lake Macquarie**  
Continuing the J-Cup Australia series, the second stop took place at **Lake Macquarie Yacht Club** (5–7 April 2025) on the peaceful waters of Lake Macquarie. After eight races over three days, **Chris Dare's AMBITION** again showed remarkable consistency — securing the overall victory with top-tier results and a dropped race. **David Doherty's MATADOR** finished second, while **Tim Ryan's VAMOS** was the leading **Corinthian** entry.

Youth crews added further excitement, with standout performances from **TRAMONTANA** and **ORA**, supporting the narrative of rising talent across Australian J/70 fleets.

## State Championship — NSW & Victorian Titles

**Sydney Harbour** played host to the 2025 **NSW State Championship** (1–3 November), where **Tim Ryan's VAMOS** navigated shifting winds and classic nor'easters to secure the title in a competitive 14-boat fleet. Ryan's team — including Rob Greenhalgh, Jess Grimes and Charlie Gundy — returned to high-performance form, while **JOUST70** and **AMBITION** also delivered podium results.

Division racing was equally compelling, with **ORA**, **JABIRU** and **TRAMONTANA** excelling across Corinthian, Young Crew and Mixed-Plus classifications — highlighting the breadth of competitive talent. Later in November, 23 boats contested the **Victorian State Championship** at **Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron** which served as another J-Cup Australia points event. A strong local and interstate turnout ensured tight one-design racing, with crews pushing hard for state honours and series points.

## 2026 Australian Championship — National Conclusion

Sydney Harbour delivered classic summer conditions for the J/70 Australian Championship, hosted by Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron from 11–16 January 2026. A moderate to fresh north-easterly breeze set

the scene for the opening three days, before a south-easter rounded out the regatta on the final day. The fleet of 18 boats sailed 12 races across four days, providing consistent and competitive racing throughout the series.

The Open Division belonged emphatically to **Tim Ryan's VAMOS**. With Rob Greenhalgh, Charlie Gundy and Drew Barnes on board, the team delivered a masterclass in consistency, never once finishing outside the top three. "Strategy wise, we just try and sail fast, get off the line clean, pick whatever shifts we can," said Charlie Gundy. "A lot of the time it is neck and neck with the other boats the whole way around."

Behind them, **SEQUEL of NUTCRACKER (Rob Davis)** and **THE BULL (David Doherty)** posted impressive series results, with Corinthian and youth entries reinforcing the Class's depth and competitive vitality.

**Youth Engagement — Sandringham Yacht Club J/70 Program**  
At **Sandringham Yacht Club**, a structured **J/70 Sailing Program** has significantly boosted youth and intermediate sailor engagement, offering progressive streams from **Social Sailing** through **Development** and **Youth/Advanced Squads**.

SYC's Eliza Ewart commented, "We have six club boats available to young members between the ages of 13-35 years old. They are designed to help transition our OTB sailors into our member keelboats. We offer the boats on Thursday afternoons for twilight

racing to anyone between the age of 18-35 years old and regularly see 4-6 boats out and almost all sharing dinner together after racing. This initiative has brought a large number of sailors back into the sport, particularly within the age group that often prioritises career development. We have witnessed a significant number transition into member boats from there. In regard to our more advanced training, on Saturdays, we have four teams that train, preparing for regattas around Australia. We have found that there are sailors joining the programs from all different Classes bringing a wealth of knowledge and skill. Both the more advanced and social sailing programs provide clear progression opportunities and bridge the gap between youth sailing and long-term club involvement. It would be amazing to have more youth teams competing, I have only positive comments about what the J/70s at SYC have done to sailing in Melbourne.

The initiative has notably increased participation among sailors aged 14 to 35, fostering both competitive skills and community engagement. Participants report gains not only in sailing performance but also in teamwork, confidence and camaraderie — feeding back into the broader competitive scene with young crews seen challenging for honours across many events."

# A Landmark Return: Porto Cervo to Host the 2028 J/70 Open World Championship

Only the J/70 can do this.



Detailed logistical guidance, including shipping information and on-site technical services, will be provided well in advance of the event.

The club's marina infrastructure, technical areas, and support services are being structured to accommodate the international fleet comfortably and efficiently throughout the Championship week.

The Real Club Náutico de Vigo considers the J/70 class a key pillar in its sporting development strategy. With a growing local fleet and increasing engagement from Spanish and international teams, the club has made a long-term commitment to support and promote the class at both national and international levels.
